

# The IPTV Subscriber's Checklist

7 things to verify before you pay for any IPTV service

We reviewed 15+ IPTV services so you know exactly what to look for. Run through this before you commit to any paid plan.

## Free trial available — no card required?

01

Always test before paying. The best services offer a 24-36 hour free trial with no payment details required. If a provider asks for card details just to run a trial, treat that as a red flag. Use the trial to test your device and confirm your key channels work reliably.

## What is the refund window?

02

Look for a minimum 7-day money-back guarantee. Three days is barely enough to properly test a service. If the refund window is 72 hours or less, make sure you use every hour of the free trial before purchasing a paid plan.

## How many simultaneous connections do you need?

03

Count every screen in your household that might stream at the same time. Some services are single-connection only regardless of plan tier. Multi-connection plans vary significantly in price — check the per-connection annual cost, not just the headline price.

## Does it have an IP lock?

04

Some IPTV services restrict streaming to a single registered IP address, blocking access from other networks. If you travel, use mobile data, or watch from a second location, check whether the service supports no-IP-lock streaming before you subscribe. Not all providers offer this.

## Is your specific device supported?

05

Confirm the service works on your device before subscribing. Most providers cover Firestick, Android, iOS, Smart TV, and PC. Fewer support Enigma2, Formuler, or Roku. Always check the provider's device list and do not assume compatibility.

## What payment methods are accepted?

06

Check payment options match what you want to use. Most providers accept card and PayPal. Some also accept Bitcoin and other cryptocurrencies. If you prefer not to link a card, check the payment page before committing — options vary significantly between providers.

## Are you on the official website?

07

Some providers have fake copycat sites using similar domain names, designed to take payment without delivering a service. Always verify the URL before entering payment details. When in doubt, find the provider via [iptvranking.com](https://iptvranking.com) where all links are verified.
